If you have ever seen churchwardens on a formal occasion, you will have noticed they carry wooden poles, sometimes called staves or prodders; surmounted by a bishop's mitre, or a royal crown, made of brass or silver. They date from the time when churchwardens represented the Church and the State. Historically prodders were used, a bit like a police truncheon, to keep order in church and churchyards if people got unruly, especially during services. We don't need to do that in 2024!

However our staves will probably make an appearance on July 15th at the licensing service of Rev Simon Grundy, our new Priest-in-Charge in the Benefice of Bywell & Mickley.

"This is a favourite hymn of mine. It says everything I want to say to God. I listen to it often. God is always there, listening to me."




Sunday 2nd June, 4 pm at St John's.



1 large or 2 small sticks of rhubarb 6oz/150g butter or margarine 8oz/200g brown sugar 6 oz/150g self-raising flour 1 egg 2 oz/50g oats 1tsp baking powder pinch salt



Grease and line a rectangular tin like a Swiss roll tin Oven GM4/180C or 350F

Thinly slice then stew the rhubarb with 1tbspn of water until it is a soft puree. Put to one side.

In a separate pan, melt the butter and sugar together.

Add melted butter/sugar to the dry ingredients and egg and mix with a wooden spoon.

Once thoroughly mixed, stir in the rhubarb puree.

Transfer into the greased tin and bake for 20 mins until golden. Mark into squares or slices while still warm then let it cool and separate the slices.

Enjoy :-)

(Instead of rhubarb you could substitute 8oz/200g sultanas or other dry fruit - we just happen to prefer the sweet, sticky rhubarb option.)



As mentioned at our benefice APCM, our parishes have both now registered with the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS). The scheme is run through Newcastle Diocese and whilst new to us, it has been in operation elsewhere since 2008. It is a secure and simple way of giving to church on a regular monthly

basis (or quarterly/annually). If eligible, you can opt to add Gift Aid, PGS claims this on our behalf, passing it back to church, simplifying the Gift Aid claim process for our churches. More information will be shared during the summer months and we hope this is something you could possibly consider opting in to. Thank you
